


Meet Some of our Honea Path Free Clinic Volunteers . . .

Without the help of dedicated volunteers, the Free Clinic would not be able to help nearly as many patients as it does. The Honea Path Free Clinic, a satellite of the Anderson Free Clinic, is open for patient care three times a month and two additional days for pharmacy. Many patients would not be able to receive care if this location did not exist since transportation is often an overwhelming obstacle.
